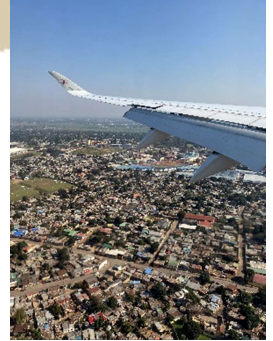


Missionaries to MOZAMBIQUE

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This August became one that we will never forget for the rest of our lives- we visited Mozambique on our survey trip for the first time! On our way to Mozambique, weather caused our flight to be delayed 24 hours; as we therefore got to know the New York airport very well, I was able to witness to a Muslim man Tirzasha. Please pray for his salvation, as well as the many others who received a gospel tract in the airport. We had a great and fun time on all the flights (our longest one was 12 hours). We can honestly say that Mozambique was better than what we hoped or prayed for. What a country of great need! Mozambique was much poorer than we thought, and we were in the capital! We can only imagine how much worse the economy is outside the



city. What excited us the most was to personally see the number of youth! They were everywhere, and they loved staring at us! The Mozambicans were so kind and welcoming; the wonderful thing about it was that we were able to converse very well with them as we used our Spanish! We knew Portuguese and Spanish were similar, but we had no idea how similar until this survey trip. It was fun learning more Portuguese phrases and words. Celina and I were able to walk around in the community for a time, and I found a group of boys to play soccer with. We had a good time, and afterwards, I was able to share the Gospel with them. They were shocked when I told them that nobody could get to heaven by doing good things! Later into our walk, we met a Muslim guy who spoke English- his name was Moses. We talked for almost an hour, and he listened very well. However, he has been deeply deceived into accepting this religion as his own- please pray for his salvation, as he is currently reading the Bible more in his search for answers. The more we visited the city as well as areas on the outskirts of the city, the more we realized how few missionaries and pastors of sound doctrine there are in Mozambique. We saw many Pentecostal churches, and were surprised to learn that the majority of Mozambicans heavily practice Animism (spirits/witch-craft).



Through our trip to Mozambique, the Lord most certainly confirmed the calling He has impressed upon our hearts to go to this country of great need and openness to the Light of the Gospel. Though there are so many different cultures and even dialects in Mozambique, we believe the Lord would have us go to one of the Portuguese-speaking cities, whether that be Maputo, or a neighboring city. We learned that more and more people in Mozambique are learning Portuguese since it is intended to be the primary and dominant language. Please pray for us as we start to learn Portuguese online, Lord willing shortly.

When we returned to the States from our survey trip, we hopped right back into deputation, full-swing. Praise the Lord 2 more churches have taken us on for support! As we traveled from a meeting, I was able to sit by Alejandro, a young man from Columbia. In Spanish, the Lord laid on my heart to witness to him, and Alejandro received Christ as his Savior! Never miss out on the opportunities God gives you to share His Word with the lost. There are still so many who want to know the Truth! We thank every one of you who has lifted us and our ministry in your prayers, as well as given of your own will, that the Word of God would have full course.
